# 2022-2023 Open Positions Review presented by Dave Holt

We need people to recruit for open positions.

It appears the district admin and board and are out of synch with faculty, students and parents; that being said this question is strictly poised to support the music in our schools.

Michael Boitz: I feel strongly about this, so many people don't know and they should. That said, I don't like this organization to take an active role in the politics of school affairs because SMB is super positive. Just for informative purposes the teachers association and the school's paper editorial voted a vote of no confidence in our board.

Dave Holt: Some parents are supportive of the board.

Rashi Sanghi: Is there an informal way of reaching out because we don't know half the things that's taking place.

Micheal Boitz: I don't want our group of parents to be sucked into negativity.

Cecile Cohen-Jonathan: Are 16 teachers leaving?

Micheal Boitz: 18 by the end of the week. We have work to do as a community to make it better.

Olivia Zhou: I am in a group of 500 parents who are concerned with what is happening in the community. This took place when Mr Boitz sent the email. The two board members in our group are defensive and say everything is fine. The community wrote many emails to the board members without a response. Chang and Zheng are in the WhatsApp group. Parents are frustrated with them.

Michael Boitz: We had a great relationship with our past superintendent. When Jon and I were freshman, mostly everyone had a doctorate degree. I think we should have a side conversation.

Dave Holt: We will remain non political.

# **Directors' Report**

**Michael Boitz:** The last month of the year went by in a flash, my family was hit with influenza B and Covid. As usual Jason had the world on his shoulders and took everything on. The kids poured their heart and soul into the final stretch of performances. Jazz band finished in a theatre performing so beautifully.

The big thing now is our tour: we are also preparing for next year's show. Mr. Shiuan is writing that complimentary and I hope he clocks out soon but he is still thinking about the show.

It really is the best time to work with teenagers, they're logical, they think mum and dad don't know anything and teachers know everything.

A student graduated a while back in 2012 and the kid comes in to Mr Shiuan to apologize saying he was a jerk in High School and continued by saying he was a pain and obnoxious. We told him that that was his job as a teenager to be like that. This moment meant the world to us because we cemented a good memory in this individual's brain. We really have sensitive kids and they are aware.

We need young blood in all leading roles.

Rashi Sanghi: we really need the soloist.

**Michael Boitz:** I have been working on an email for 2 days covering safety precautions, extra hotel rooms in case of COVID. Test before arriving, etc,. we know every 24hr service, doctors who do home visits etc. We are thinking in the event we have people who are coming back last. We have handed out the handbook which includes precise details.

**Isabel McPherson**: End of the year concert went really well, they were the less stressful concerts i have ever conducted. Combining the orchestras was first my nightmare and then it turned out to be the best thing ever.

This year was a satisfying ending to the year. I will be excited for next year and be well rested.

We are going to pull up some instruments to RMS. We need to address sizes for cellos and basses. We are swapping 10 basses. And we just have to pay for the shipping.

Dave Holt: When do you need to pull the trigger to have this happen?

Isabelle McPherson: I need to do it before school starts.

# Orchestra Expenses in Anticipation of Increased Enrollment 2022-2023

Southwest Strings - \$900

- Swap 6x1/4 and 2-4x1/2 size cellos for 8-10 3/4 size cellos
- We pay shipping costs only
- ~\$450 per pallet hopefully it all fits on one pallet, would like to budget for 2 pallets just in case

## Krutz Strings - \$2500

- Swap 6 1/8 size basses for 1/4 size basses
- Upgrading incoming basses from 100-level to 200-level @ \$200/instrument
- Need to be palletized and shipped back freight Quotes around \$1000
- They have actually offered to ship us the ¼ basses first, so I can ship back the ¼ in the same boxes
  - They may need to wait for 1 more container to have all 6 200-series at once, so we will take care of this in July after I come back from grad school

#### Wenger - \$1214

- RMS only owns 2 bass racks (8 slots) and needs a 3rd to safely hold all
  instruments that will be in use next year at a cost of \$993 + freight shipping
- If there is a handy parent or Eagle Scout looking for a summer project, this
  expense could be reduced to just the cost of materials (there are some plans
  online)

Total: \$4,614

Note: If 5th grade instrument interest stays the same, we will use a mix of violins or violas in 5th grade next year - students won't necessarily have a "choice" as everything we learn will be identical between the 2 instruments. There is a small chance we may need more  $\frac{1}{2}$  size violins but because those don't have to be put on a pallet they are easier to swap out later.

Alicia de Fuentes motions to approve the **Orchestra Expenses in Anticipation of Increased Enrollment 2022-2023** budget as presented.

Senthil Krishnamurthy: seconds

Approved unanimously.

Excited about next year, this year was a challenge, and we ended up all the music kids ourselves. So next year we will have a music teacher. The year ended really well. We have the legal document ready to start the relationship with SUSD and SMB.

**Jason Shiuan**: Great choir concert with RMS, there was a little bit of last minute craziness. So all the choir students had to be tested and results came back negative. They had a great concert regardless. The AP theory had their last concert 2 Fridays ago. There was one student I asked if they could write their music out for jazz band.

A lot of marching band planning is going ahead and it will be a fun season. Excited to receive the class of 2026.

Cecile Cohen-Jonathan: wil there be an AP music theory every other year for the enrollment ?

**Michael Boitz**: If there was a solid number of enrollments we would advertise but there were not enough students signed up for AP theory this coming year. That is why it is offered every other year. Can't go wrong with elective offerings at this school.
